To complete the Blizzard Bags, you will need to use a book you are currently reading. It can be the book you are reading in Reading class, an AR book you are reading on your own, or a family favorite that you have at home.

For Blizzard Bag #1, please complete one activity from Column A, one from Column B, and one from Column C. (3 total activities)

For Blizzard Bag #2, please complete a second activity from Columns A, B, & C. Again, 3 total activities. Do not repeat ones done for Bag #1.

For Blizzard Bag #3, please complete a third activity from Columns A, B, & C. Again, 3 total activities. Do not repeat ones done for Bag #1 or #2.

| What character in your story would you like to invite over to your house? Explain why you chose this character and what you would do. | You are going to give one character in your book an award for one of their character traits. | Make a list of 3 songs that the main character in your book would probably have on their playlist. Write the titles and why you chose them. | Make a new front cover for your book. It should be on white paper and in color. It <u>cannot</u> look like the original book cover. | Create a bookmark that includes the conflict or problem of your story. Tell what the conflict is and if it was resolved. |
| Write a three sentence summary of a section or chapter of your book. Make sure that the details are in the order of the story. | If you wrote a sequel to this story or book, what title would you give it and why? Which characters would still be in your sequel? | Create a reading quiz for your book. Write at least three multiple choice questions and two true or false questions. Include the answers. |
| Write a recommendation for your book. Who would enjoy your book? Include positive and negative opinions you may have. | Find two new or challenging words from your story. Use context to define the words and explain why they are important to the story. | Did something in your story remind you of your own life, another book, or the world. Share your connection. (The part in the story when ____ reminds me of ____) |
